Farming in the Santa Clara River Valley An Endangered Spiecies?

As housing developments spread along the Santa Clara River, less and less land is used to grow food. Increased traffic adds to air pollution that lowers crop yields. Chlorides in the water from up stream urbanization prevent efficient growth of strawberries and avacados, two of the Santa Clara River Valley's most important crops. A viable farming economy is disappearing from Southern California.
