TIME	FILM/LOCATION	SUMMARY
10:00 am - 12:00 pm	Common Ground (UCEN 107)	This inspiring documentary unveils a dark web of money, power, and politics behind our broken food system. It also profiles a hopeful and uplifting movement of white, black, and indigenous farmers using regenerative models of agriculture that could balance the climate, save our health, and stabilize America's economy.
	Cowspiracy: The Sustainability Secret (UCEN 258)	A groundbreaking documentary following filmmaker Kip Anderson as he uncovers the most destructive industry facing the planet today—animal agriculture—and investigates why the world's leading environmental organizations are too afraid to talk about it. He's warned of the risks to his freedom and life if he dares to persist.
12:00 pm - 12:45 pm	Burnt Country (UCEN 258)	In this beautiful, award-winning short film, filmmaker Kirsten Slemint centers the work of Tasmania's Indigenous Melukerdee people, who have long used low-temperature fires to reduce fuel load and control far more destructive burns. Their Indigenous fire practices are instructive during our current wildfire challenges.
12:00 pm - 1:30 pm	Lunch Break	Tacos Jimenez (*truck on site 11am - 3pm)
12:45 pm - 1:30 pm	Saging the World (UCEN 107)	White sage grows wild only in Southern California and Baja California, Mexico, and poachers are stealing tons of it to supply international demand. This documentary spotlights the ecological and cultural issues involving white sage, focusing on the voices of Native advocates who have long cherished and protected this plant.
1:30 pm - 3:30 pm	Send Kelp! (UCEN 107)	A 20ish woman in British Columbia wanting to do something meaningful with her life learns that kelp is being decimated by sea urchins. The film follows her efforts, eventually very fruitful, to start kelp farms along the BC coast, illustrating what was learned along the way and how to do this successfully.
	Buy Now: The Shopping Conspiracy (UCEN 258)	This revealing documentary about consumerism focuses on fast fashion and clothing, electronics, and plastics in particular. It reveals secret advertising tricks major global brands use to drive consumerism, the extreme waste that results, and the real impact these things have on our lives and the world.
